### From the Executive Director's Desk:

#### Dear Friends of St. Joseph's Medical Clinic,

Our clinic is in its 43rd year of operation. Our mission is to serve the uninsured, underinsured, vulnerable and low-income community members in Waukesha County. I am fortunate to be the new Executive Director for St. Joseph's Medical Clinic. I started my new position at the end of August 2018. Prior to my role as the Executive Director I worked in healthcare leadership at a local hospital, most recently in the role of Vice President of Nursing. I find this experience of over 30 years in acute care beneficial to the clinic setting. It provides me with skills to help drive and support the work the clinic is doing. I am amazed at the dedication and commitment that staff, volunteers, board and community members provide to create a clinic that continues to grow, is reliable and provides a consistent healthcare environment for our community. As we look forward, we continue to strive for new ways to create sustainability for our clinic for the years to come. We ask our community supporters to share with us their talent, time and financial resources so we can continue to provide the necessary healthcare services for many more years.



### Healthcare in 2019

During the year of 2019 we are focusing on Mental Health Services, Homelessness, Diabetic Care and Management, Smoking Cessation, and Hispanic Woman Health and Wellness, in addition to being able to provide unique and specialty clinic offerings that help a community stay healthy and well in their lives.

We continue to look for a new facility to relocate to and expand our current healthcare services. We are currently working with a local university in partnership to help meet our goal of a new facility and increased clinic hours.

We are excited to share our accomplishments with our community. Recently, we received an **"Exceeds Expectations"** from United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County. They shared that the program achieved an **"Exceeds Expectations rating – Program activities, outcomes and/or partnership were exemplary. Examples of exemplary performance: program increased capacity or reach, added new elements, identified and met new needs, or improved significantly over previous year. Program was also in compliance in terms of all reporting and financials."** We continue to focus on the Standards of Excellence, a program developed by The Wisconsin Association of Free & Charitable Clinics, Inc. to improve quality care in free and charitable clinics. We have achieved the Bronze Seal and will be working toward the Silver level. Always keeping in mind, the clinic's goal is to provide excellent care to all in our community.

# Success Story & Updates

## Recent Success Story:

St. Joseph's Medical Clinic, Inc. (SJMC) is proud to share with you a recent success story written by our Homeless Outreach Nurse, Shelley Beverage.

*"I have been doing wellness checks at The Hope Center since I started this job in May of 2018. I had seen this client, T.I., every time I went to the center; he would interact with other clients but never interacted with me. On June 28th, I noticed that he had two black eyes. I decided to take a chance; I looked at him, smiled, and said "Well you look a little different than you did the last time I saw you." He smiled back and explained to me that he ran out of his epilepsy medication and had a seizure. I let him know that if he ever needed help with his medication, to let me know. This turned out to be the icebreaker that began a little trusting relationship. From then on, he would have me take his blood pressure but never would open up about anything else. I continued to see him every week at the Hope Center. Finally, on September 4th, he asked for help. He was running low on medication and started explaining his situation. He is currently homeless, he lost everything he owned when he had a seizure in June. This included his ID, his food share card, his forward health card, and his phone. Right then I asked him if he had time to meet me at St. Joseph's Medical Clinic to start working on getting some of these items back. He met me at the clinic later that day and we began working on getting those items back for him. By the end of September, he had a government phone, his ID card, his forward health card, and his food share card. He also decided to sign up for the PATH program and allow me to be his case manager. With the help of Sunnie from NAMI (National Alliance of Mental Illness), he was signed up for PATH (Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness) and entered into HMIS (Homeless Management Information System). Johneisha from HAC (Housing Action Coalition) also met us at the clinic in September and entered him into Coordinated Entry to help him with housing."*



Our homeless program has been a large part of our mission for many years and we work tirelessly each day to help the less fortunate in our community. Your donations make it possible for us to share such wonderful success stories such as the one above. As always, we appreciate your support.

## Clinic News & Updates:

St. Joseph's Medical Clinic, Inc. (SJMC) is proud to announce that we have successfully launched a Behavioral Health Support Group led by a licensed professional counselor, Elizabeth Bondy, LPC. Elizabeth has graciously offered her services to SJMC to run this much needed support group for our community. Sessions will be held at our facility on the 2nd Tuesday and 3rd Thursday of each month. To learn more about the Behavioral Health Support Group, please call our office at 262-544-6777.

In addition, we have also added a Diabetic Clinic which is held on the 3rd Monday of every month. This new program is led by nurse practitioners who provide individualized care and education to our patients who have been diagnosed with diabetes. This



includes medications, diabetic supplies, education and overall support for their healthcare.

As we continue to grow, we are working to build additional programs that will include a Hispanic Wellness Clinic and Smoking Cessation program. The Hispanic Wellness Clinic will focus on the overall health and wellness of Hispanic women in our community on the 3rd Friday of each month. The Smoking Cessation program will assist our patients in their journey to quit smoking and will be held on the 2nd Monday of each month at our Waukesha Family Practice location.

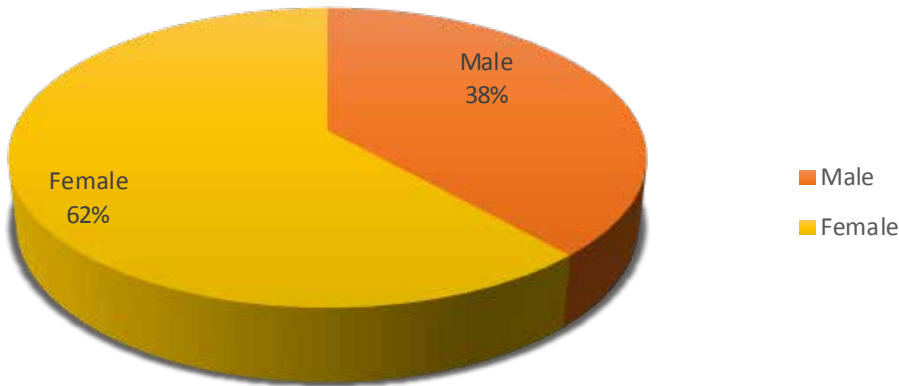
## Homeless Medical Case Outreach And Management

We are a member agency of the Housing Action Coalition/Continuum of Care in Waukesha County. We have on staff a Registered Nurse acting in the capacity of Medical Case Manager to reach out to individuals and families who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. As of January 2016, there were close to 200 individuals homeless and living on the street, an 11% increase from 2015. Our services assist 60+ individuals with medical care, patient health education, medications and referrals to gain housing, transportation, and food. 6% of those we serve are in shelter.

## GENDER

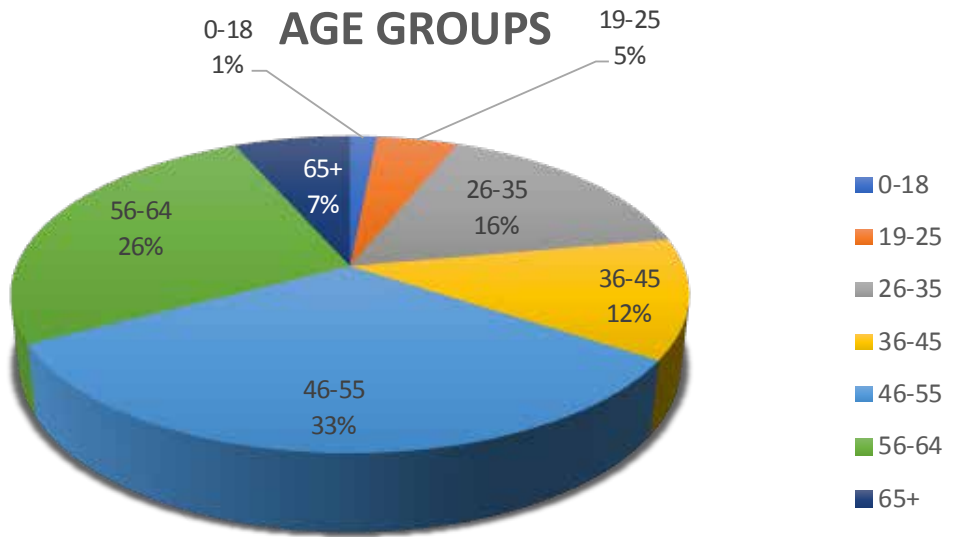

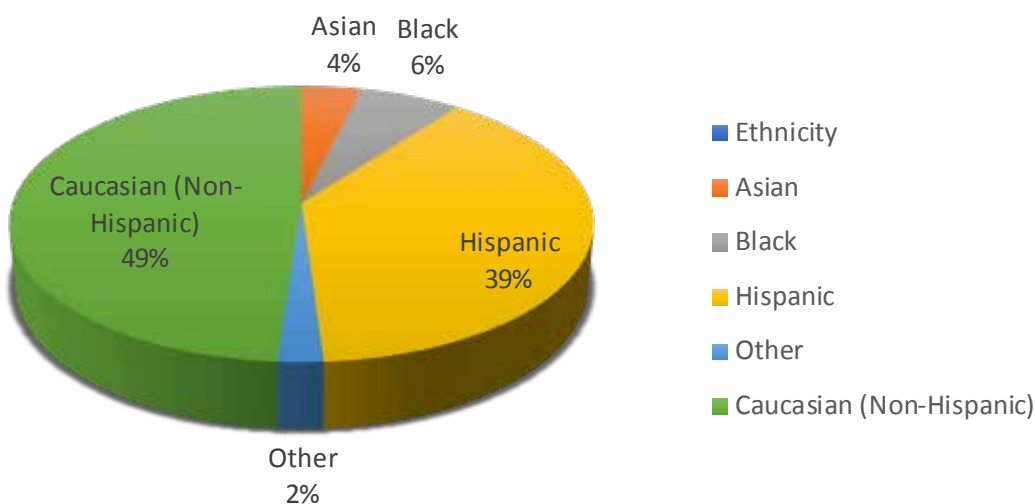

As we continue to see more female patients in our clinic we have developed a Women's Wellness program which will provide physical exams, education and psychosocial support to address the needs of our community.

Medical care is important at any age in life. Although we currently do not have the resources to treat infants, we do offer many services to patients of varying ages. Although a large percentage of our patients are in the 46-55 year range, we work closely with all patients to insure proper health concerns are assessed on a regular basis. We also work closely with patients to help them with long term healthcare goals. Whether this is a monthly visit to our Diabetic Clinic, getting connected with a Primary Care Physician in the area, or simply assisting with medication coverage, our patients' well-being is our overall goal.

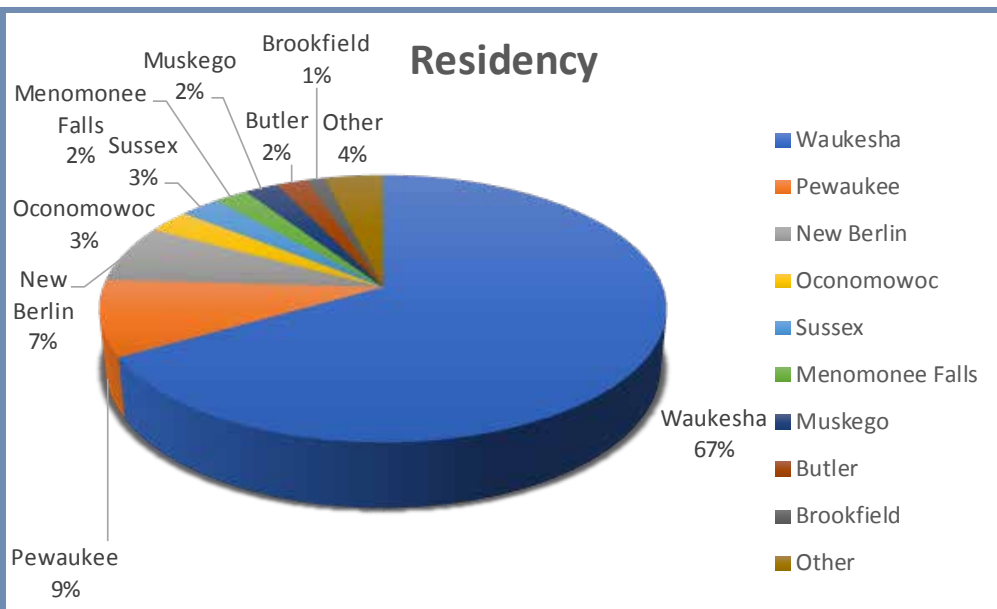


## Ethnicity

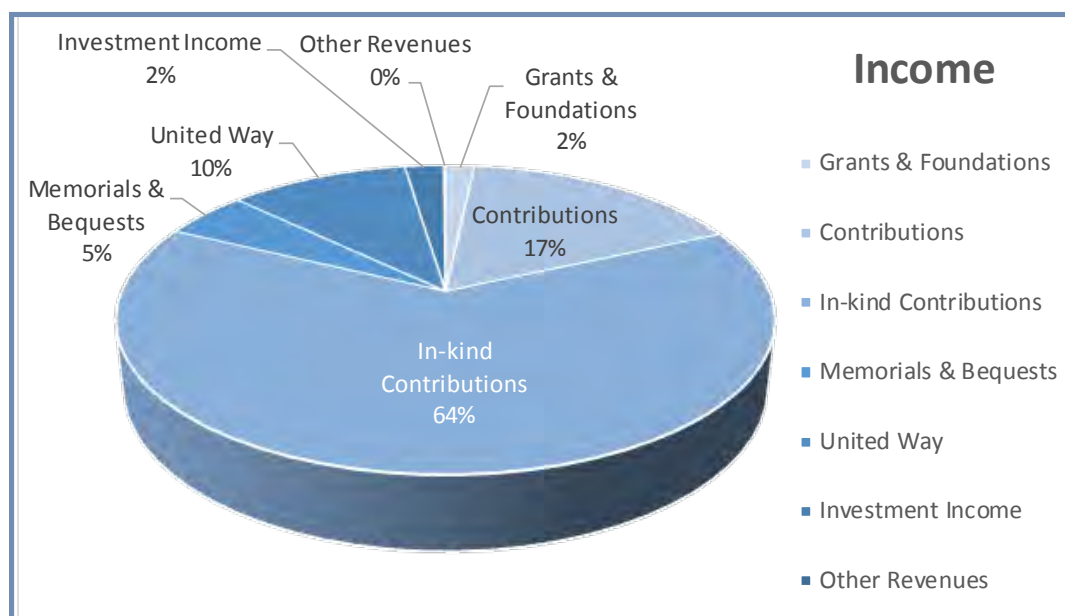

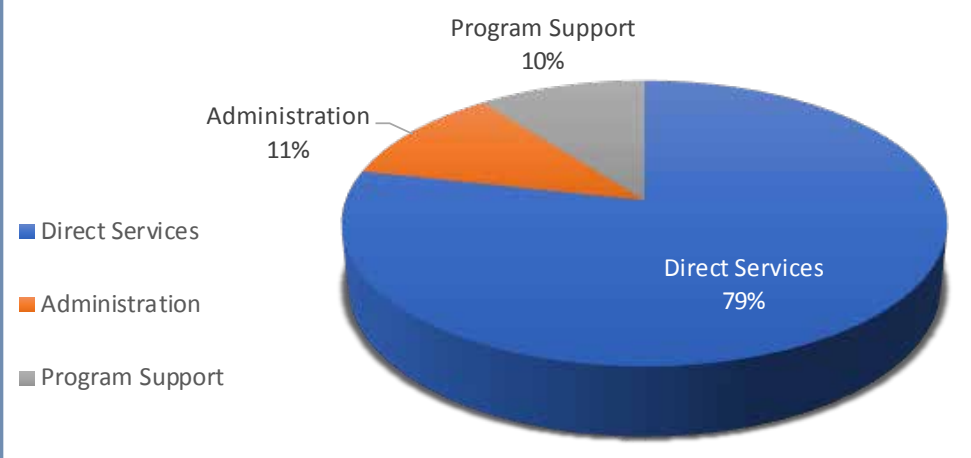

- **\$50 a month** will pay for a 30 day supply of Cefdinir, an antibiotic that treats infections including, bacterial pneumonia.
- **\$200** will pay for 5 Ventolin inhalers for a person with asthma. This inhaler can prevent an unnecessary hospital stay.
- **\$500** will purchase 1 portable Pulse Oximeter unit to quickly assess a patient's oxygen saturation and pulse.
- **\$1500** will purchase 1 OnSite Defibrillator unit for use in our clinic.

Thankfully, this winter we had a wonderful group of students volunteer to assemble care packages for our homeless patients. These 8 students from Divine Redeemer Lutheran School in Hartland, led by their instructor Mr. Vermillion, took the time to gather items to assemble Health Kit bags as part of their “How To Run A Nonprofit” lesson. These bags included things such as nail clippers, socks, mittens, travel cups, snacks, hand sanitizers and more. We commend these students in their work and thank them for assisting us in our mission.



Are you looking to make a difference in your community? We are always looking for dedicated volunteers to assist us in our mission. Whether it's once a month or two days a week, we always appreciate the help. Below is a list of volunteer positions that are currently open:

**Medical Provider Or Nursing Opportunity (MD or RN)** - Help us further our mission in the community by sharing your professional skills and assisting underinsured and uninsured residents of Waukesha County. The Medical Provider volunteer cares for patients during clinics while the Nurse assists the provider. Both opportunities also include working with a staff nurse during daytime office hours. Training includes an orientation session, shadowing, and ongoing support by staff nurses and office personnel. Flexibility to fit your schedule. Assist us once a month or once a week. *Active and retired MDs and RNs encouraged to apply!*

**Pharmacy Billing Assistant** - St. Joseph's has an ongoing partnership with a local pharmacy, wherein each month there are 2 billing cycles on the 15th and 1st, which must be reconciled with patient charts. We are seeking an independent minded volunteer to assist with this billing reconciliation and updating the patient's Electronic Medical Records (EMR). This work is critical to providing high quality patient care. Volunteers for this position must have clinical background (MD, PA, RN, LNP, etc.) but does not require being currently licensed. This position would be 2 days per month, 2-4 hours each day. Training in the reconciliation process and EMR provided. *Retirees welcome!*

**Medical Clinic Receptionists** - Looking to make an impact in your community? Be a vital volunteer at the medical clinic! Greet patients and help them fill out paperwork so they can be seen by a doctor. An important part of this position is assisting patients with intake and financial forms, obtaining documentation, and reviewing forms for accuracy and completeness. Bilingual skills are a plus, but not required. Flexibility to fit your schedule. Assist us once a month or once a week. *Retirees welcome!*

**Medical Write-Off/Billing Assistant** - Do you have a talent for billing? We are looking for your help with our medical write-off/billing process. Being a free clinic, many laboratory and radiology tests are donated by our partner hospital. These tests need to be reported to the appropriate partners to be submitted for write-off to prevent patients from being billed. We need your help to verify tests performed, enter write-off information and communicate with appropriate partners. This is an on-going position that would be ideal for 1-2 people on a long term basis averaging 2 hours per week during our office hours of 9am-5pm Monday-Friday.
